Mobile Elevated Work Platforms (MEWPS) are used across all sectors to provide temporary working platforms at height. Most incidents and injuries are caused by operator error

Course Overview

Platforms are designed to be easy to use and offer a safe way to work at height. With basic training you will be able to use the equipment more effectively and safely. This course instructs an operator how to prepare and safely operate various types of MEWPs including scissor lifts, boom lifts (3a & 3b), trailer mounted or truck mounted platforms (1a & 1b).

Upon the successful completion of IPAF training and assessment, candidates of the course will receive a PAL (Powered Access Licence) Card, demonstrating competence in the preparation and use of the relevant machine(s).

Course Syllabus

This course covers the following subject matter:

- Awareness of different types of MEWPs
- Safe operation and limitations of use
- Pre-use checks, inspection and function tests
- Planning the route before operating the MEWP; travelling the route and manoeuvring the MEWP
- Selection and use of fall arrest equipment; emergency descent systems; harness and lanyard anchor points
- Basic operational practice
- Achievement testing
- Dangers of fuelling/charging
- SWL and limiters
- Guardrails and inbuilt safety features
- Log book issue and inspection recording
- Overview of regulations and guidance
- Environmental and ground conditions
- Course review and close
